



May 11 – Sombrero chino Island / Rabida Island: <u>Sombrero Chino</u>: Sombrero Chino is a small volcanic island just off the southeast tip of Santiago. The name of the island describes the shape of the island. Fauna includes Sea lions, marine iguanas and the Galapagos



penguin. This small island with its white sand beach is always a pleasure to visit and a favorite to snorkel. After breakfast you will enjoy a short hike along the coast of the island stopping to admire the sealion colony and unique lava formations. Afterwards there will be snorkeling along the coast of Santiago Island. In the noon hours the boat will navigate to Rabida Island. Rábida Island: Rábida is a small island with a dark red coral sand beach. Highlights include the lagoon with flamingoes, pelican nesting site, sea

lion bachelor colony, and a snorkeling site at the end of the beach.

May 12 – Isabela Island: <u>Isabela Island</u> (Albemarle): Isabela is the largest of the Galapagos Islands formed by five active volcanoes fused together. Wolf Volcano is the highest point in the entire Galapagos at 1707m.

<u>Sierra Negra</u>: Volcan Sierra Negra has a caldera with a diameter of 10km. View recent lava flows, moist highland vegetation, and parasitic cones. <u>Puerto Villamil:</u> Puerto Villamil is a charming small town on a white sand beach. Highlights include the Tortoise Breeding Station and the flamingo lagoon. Other visits (depending on conditions) are the

Tintoreras or Los Humedales





May 13 - Isabela Island - Elizabeth Bay/Punta Moreno:

Elizabeth Bay: This spot is only accessible by dinghy. It is possible to see penguins on the small islets in the bay. The end of the bay is long and narrow surrounded by three species of mangroves. Galapagos Sea Turtles and rays can usually be seen in the water. Punta Moreno: Punta Moreno is located in the central southwestern coast of Isabela Island. The site has spectacular views of volcanoes Alcedo, Sierra Negra and Cerro Azul. Some highlights include impressive lava flows, desolate and pristine landscape, varied and unusual arid zone vegetation.





May 14 - Isabela Island - Urbina Bay / Tagus Cove:

<u>Urbina Bay</u>: Urbina Bay is located at the central-west coast of Isabela Island at the foothills of Alcedo and Darwin volcanoes. Highlights include the colourful land iguanas, Galapagos Giant tortoises and the coral uplifting from 1954.

<u>Tagus Cove:</u> Tagus Cove is a natural harbor where centuries ago whalers and pirates left their ship's names painted or carved on the rocks. A walk uphill to Darwin's Crater salt-water lake will provide an excellent view.

May 15 – Fernandina Island – Puta Espinoza & Island – Punt Vicente Roca:

Punta Espinoza: Punta Espinoza is a place famous for its large colonies of marine iguanas

and as the habitat of unique species like the flightless cormorant, Galapagos penguin, Galapagos hawk, Galapagos snake, among others.



May 16 – James (Santiago) Island / Bartolome Island: James (Santiago) Island:

This Island is located between Isabela and Santa Cruz Islands. This Island offers a wide variety of seabirds, marine iguanas and fur seals.

Playa Espumilla: Espumilla Beach has a beautiful

contrast between the golden beach and the green mangroves. It is

also a great site to see flamingos, pintail ducks, green sea turtle nests and the Galapagos Hawk.

<u>Buccaneers Cove:</u> This site was Charles Darwin's home for 9 days. As well as a resting site for many whalers and pirates. With this rich history Buccaneers Cove is a must see. Enjoy a panga ride or snorkel looking for Galapagos Fur Seals, Brown Noodies. Pelicans & Swallow-tailed Gulls

<u>Bartolome Island:</u> Famous for its pinnacle rock and penguins. A hike will take you to the highest point on Bartolome for a spectacular view. Sea lions and penguins can be seen around Pinnacle Rock. There is a sandy beach with great swimming and snorkeling.





May 17 – In Transit: This morning you will say goodbye to your amazing guide & crew on Beluga as you will be transferred to the Baltra airport as you fly back to Quito. Here you will have a hotel room for day use until you are transferred to the airport to connect with your international flight home full of fantastic memories of a most unusual land! Or.... How about a visit to Peru including Lima, Machu Picchu, Sacred Valley and the Nazca Lines?

CLIMATE: May will be a great to visit Galapagos and Ecuador. The rain forest will be just that — wet, humid and a real treat to experience. You will experience incredible downpours one minute and bright sun and blue skies the next. Bring your dry bag for camera gear! On the Galapagos Islands, the weather will be dry and warm. Temperatures could range into the high 20's low 30's but very dry. The water will be warm at this time making snorkeling and swimming very comfortable and often a welcome relief! Some of the islands have cooler currents and therefore you may want to bring a wetsuit for more time in the water.

May 3, 4, 5 – Napo Wildlife Centre, Ecuador (3 nights): A varied travel day from Quito to Napo Wildlife Centre encompassing a flight over the majestic Andes Mountain's snow-covered peaks and a motorized (2.5 hour) boat trip down the Napo River, largest river in Ecuadorian Amazonia. Upon arrival to the boat dock, you will have time for a loo break and then will be paddled along a narrow creek that connects to the lake where the lodge is located. https://www.napowildlifecenter.com

Hike along primary forest to discover the forest interior, possibilities of finding lizards, colorful manakins or the unique and endemic Golden mantle tamarin monkeys.
