Kenya - Nairobi and Amboseli National Park

February 14 & 15, 2027: Travel from North America to Nairobi, Kenya is typically routed through Amsterdam, Frankfurt, or London. We are happy to assist with booking your flights. An optional stopover in any of these gateway cities is a wonderful way to ease jet lag and begin your journey feeling refreshed.

February 15, 2027 - Stanley Hotel, Nairobi Kenya - www.sarovahotels.com/stanley

(3 nights): Arrive in Nairobi in the evening, where you will be warmly met and transferred to the historic Stanley Hotel for an overnight stay on a B&B basis. A perfect opportunity to unwind and enjoy a well-earned rest.

February 16: After a hearty breakfast in the Thorntree Café, we set out for the Giraffe Centre to meet the charming



Rothschild's giraffes up close.

From there, we continue to the Kazuri Bead Workshop to see how their beautiful ceramic beads and pottery are handcrafted by local artisans. Lunch and dinner will be enjoyed at lovely local restaurants; however, these meals are not included in the tour pricing. B



February 17: Today brings a very special experience as we visit the Sheldrick Wildlife Trust Elephant Orphanage Nursery where you'll have the chance to meet and observe some of the orphaned baby elephants in their care.

February 18 - Amboseli Serena Safari Lodge, Amboseli National Park, Kenya (2 nights)

www.serenahotels.com : We travel south with the majestic silhouette of Mount Kilimanjaro rising to the east. En route, we stop at the AIC Kajiado Girls School to spend meaningful time with some truly remarkable students. The school serves more than 700 girls, including approximately 140 who have been rescued from forced marriage or are orphaned - young girls whose resilience and spirit will capture your heart. After visiting with the girls, we pause for a relaxed picnic lunch.



Our journey continues into Amboseli National Park, game driving as we make our way to our beautiful lodge. Settle in and enjoy a scrumptious dinner to end this memorable day. B,L,D

February 19: The day includes both an early morning and a late afternoon game drives as we explore

the wonders of Amboseli National Park. Though one of Kenya's smaller parks, Amboseli is renowned for its impressive elephant population, often seen in large family groups against the backdrop of Mount Kilimanjaro. Lion sightings here can be excellent as well, adding to the excitement of the day. B,L,D



Tanzania - Lake Manyara National Park, Ngorongoro Crater, Serengeti National Park

February 20 - Lake Manyara Serena Lodge, Tanzania (2 nights) www.serenahotels.com:

Say farewell to Kenya as we travel south to the Namanga border and cross into Tanzania. Here, we goodbye to our Kenya guides and Jambo to our Tanzania guides and continue west toward Lake Manyara, watching the landscape transform in real time. Along the way, enjoy encounters with the vibrant local cultures—especially the Maasai, adorned in their strikingly colorful kangas. Lunch is in Arusha, Tanzania on a lovely coffee plantation. Arrive at your luxurious lodge perched on the edge of the escarpment overlooking Lake Manyara National Park, just in time for dinner and a bit of unforgettable stargazing. B,L,D



February 21: After a hearty breakfast, we depart the lodge and descend into the valley for an in-depth exploration of Lake Manyara National Park. Known for its exceptionally high elephant population, the park often offers wonderful opportunities to observe these gentle giants up close.

Lake Manyara is also an excellent place to see large numbers of giraffe, buffalo, and a variety of primates. You can expect good sightings of Sykes monkeys, along with baboons and vervet monkeys moving through the forested areas. Lunch will be a relaxed picnic with a beautiful view of the lake.

Afterward, we return to the lodge for dinner and an overnight stay. B,L,D

February 22 - Ngorongoro Rim Lodge (2 nights)

After breakfast, continue our journey west to the world famous Ngorongoro Crater - one of the most unique wildlife viewing spectacles in Africa. Enjoy lunch at the Serena Lodge and then carry onto visit a working Maasai Village. This is a wonderful opportunity to ask questions, take photos and engage with these vibrant and gracious people, who are always eager to share their traditions and way of life. Return to the lodge for dinner and a relaxing evening. B,L,D



February 23: An early departure takes us down into the heart of the Ngorongoro Crater itself. This remarkable ecosystem encompasses open savanna, lush forest, and permanent wetlands, providing a constant supply of water and grazing for antelope and zebra so there is no need for them to migrate. The crater is also one of the best places in East Africa to observe prides of lion. With luck, we may encounter a breeding pair and witness the fascinating interactions between the striking males and their tawny females.



If fortune smiles on us, we may even spot the endangered Black Rhino, an unforgettable privilege, and one we'll certainly be hoping for.

Lunch will be a relaxed picnic beside a hippo pool, where you can watch these massive creatures spout and snort as they wallow. Later, return to the lodge to enjoy another breathtaking sunset from the crater rim, followed by a delicious dinner and a restful night in preparation for the next adventure. B,L,D

February 24 – Lake Ndutu Luxury Tented Lodge (3 nights)

At this time of year, we are perfectly positioned, right in the heart of the migration, where the drama and beauty of this natural spectacle unfold all around you.

CLIMATE – The climate in Kenya and Tanzania is generally dry, sunny, and warm, with daytime temperatures averaging 28–30°C. Evenings can become cool, especially in higher-elevation areas such as the Ngorongoro Highlands, so packing a sweater or fleece is a smart idea.

The short rains have just ended, and depending on how much rainfall the region received, you can expect to see lush greenery and vibrant landscapes—a beautiful contrast to the typically dry plains. The hottest period is in October, when daytime temperatures often climb into the mid-30s

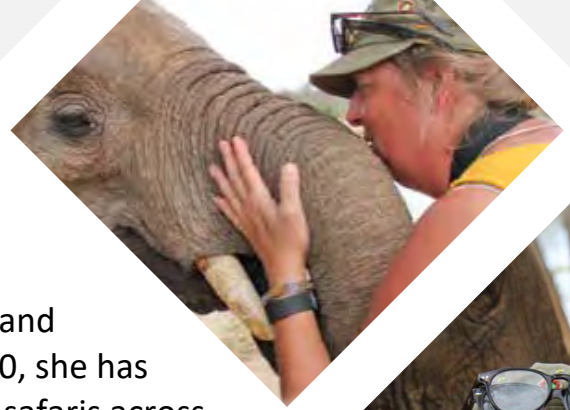
